PROCEDURE & RULES OF ADMISSION

- 1. Admission in merit seat will be through CAP by online registration. (www.cap.mgu.ac.in)
- 2. Management Quota and Community Quota application forms and prospectus can be had from the college website on remitting prescribed fee (www.sgcaruvithura.ac.in)
- 3. Photocopies of the mark lists of the qualifying examinations and conduct certificate should be uploaded in the CAP and Management site.
- 4. Merit list and date of interview will be announced by the MG University
- 5. Applicants should attend the interview with father / guardian along with relevant documents with allotment memo.
- 6. Subsequent vacancies will be filled on the days fixed by the university through CAP allotment.
- 7. Admission is ensured when all fees are remitted.
- 8. The principal reserves to himself the right to reject admission to any student without as signing reasons.
- 9. UGC REGULATIONS ON CURBING THE MENACE OF RAGGING IN HIGHER EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS, 2009 (Under Section 26 (1) (g) of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956) F.1–16/2007 (CPP-II) Dated 17th June 2009.
- 10. Applicants are adviced to keep sufficient photo copies of their qualifying certificates. The orginal certificates submitted in the office will not be return to them before the end of the course.

ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION

- **BA Degree Programmes:** Admission to all degree programmes under the faculties of Language & Literature and Social Sciences shall be open to candidates who have passed plus two.
- **B.Sc. Food Science And Quality Control:** Candidates who have passed plus two or equivalent examination with atleast one of the following as an individual subject of study: Physics/Chemistry/Mathematics/Biology combination.
- **B.Sc. Botany:** Candidates shall be required to have passed the Plus Two/equivalent examination with Biology as one of the optional subjects at plus two level.
- **B.Sc. Mathematics:** Candidates shall be required to have passed the plus two/equivalent examination with Mathematics as one of the optional subjects or Mathematics as one of the subjects in Commerce group.
- **B.Sc.** Physics/B.Sc. Chemistry: Candidates shall be required to have passed the plus two/equivalent examination with Physics/Chemistry respectively as one of the optional subjects at plus two level.

Bachelor of Computer Applications (BCA): Candidates shall be required to have passed the plus two/ equivalent examination in science stream with Mathematics/Computer Science/ Informatics Practice as optional.

Bachelor of Commerce (B.Com): Admission of the B.Com. degree programme shall be open only to candidates who have passed the Plus Two or equivalent examination recognized by this University with Book- keeping and Accountancy and any two of the following subjects, viz.,

- 1. Commerce
- 2. Commercial Correspondence and Commercial Geography
- 3. Economics
- 4. Life Insurance with Salesmanship
- 5. Banking with Secretarial Practice
- 6. Business Studies

- Mathematics
- 8. Computer Science / Computer Applications
- 9. Informatics Practice & Management
- 10. Informatics Practice
- 11. Management
- 12. Accountancy as optional under Part III of the Examination.

OR To have passed Plus Two or equivalent examination recognized by this University with other subjects under Part III optional subjects provided they have secured 45% of the aggregate.

CALCULATION OF MERIT MARKS

M.Sc. Programmes

CSS Pattern

CGPA secured for Part III Core + complementary Courses is taken into account for the calculation of index marks as stated below:-

{(CGPA (Core Courses) x 2 x total credit of Core Courses) + (CGPA of complementary Courses I x total credit for complementary course II x total credit for complementary courses II)} / (total credit for core courses x 2 + total credit for complementary courses)

- A x 25 = percentage of marks
- B x 10 = marks out of 1000
- Index Mark = C + Weightage + Bonus marks -Handicap Marks, if any
- Marks Secured for part III Main + Subsidiary (for Model I) or Core + Complementary + Vocational (Model II) is converted into 1000.
- Marks Secured for part III Main/ Core papers out of 600
- 3. The marks thus arrived at is standardized to 1000.
- Index mark = C + (weightage + bonus marks, if any) - (handicap marks if any)

For graduates who have passed B Com Model I programme CBCSS Pattern Pre - CBCSS Pattern

CGPA Secured for Core Course x total credit of core Course + CGPA (Complementary Course) x total credit for complementary Course)

- A x 25 = percentage of marks
- B x 10 = marks = C + weightage + bonus marks

Marks secured for part III main Papers is converted into 1000. Index mark is calculated after adding / deducting weightage / bonus / handicap marks, if any

For graduates who have passed B Com Model II/Model III/BBA/BBM

CGPA Secured for part III Core Courses is converted into percentage marks by multiplying the same by 10. Index mark is calculated after adding / deducting the weightage / bonus marks / handicap marks if any

In the case of candidates who have passed B Com Model II, marks secured for part III Core Papers is converted into 1000. In the case of candidates who have passed BBA total marks obtained excluding the marks of English, Social Project, Management Project, Viva shall be converted to 1000 and in the case of candidates who have passed BBM total marks obtained excluding the marks of English, Industrial training and Project report and Comprehensive Viva-Voce shall be converted to 1000. Index mark is calculated after adding / deducting weightage / bonus / handicap marks, if any.

CALCULATION OF MERIT MARKS

B.Sc Programmes

For applicants who have passed Higher Secondary

Merit mark = Total marks for Part III OF HIGHER Secondary + Marks of the Subject Choice + Weightage Marks as applicable – Deductions if any.

BA Economics / Politics

Merit Mark = Total Marks for Higher Secondary + marks for Subject of Choice + 50 Marks for B.A Economics Politics if the student has studied Economics / Politics as a subject at Higher Secondary level + Weightage Marks Deduction if any.

BA English

Merit mark = Total marks for Higher Secondary + Two times marks for Part I English + weightage Marks Deductions if any.

B.Com

Marks obtained for Part III Optional at the Higher Secondary or Equivalent examination less handicap marks + a weightage 50 marks in each of the subject of commerce combination, subject to a maximum of 150 marks. The concerned optional under Part II= will be Commerce / Commercial Correspondence & Commercial Geography / Book- keeping & Accountancy / Economics / Life Insurance & Salesmanship / Banking with Secretarial Practice / Business Studies / Mathematics / Computer Science / Computer Application / Informatics Practice / Management.

B.Sc. Food Science & Quality Control

Merit mark= Total marks for Optional Subjects. (Total marks should be calculated as out of 800.) Food act of the government is expected to be in force with effect from the next year onwards and therefore job opportunities will increase to the degree holders of Food Science and Quality Control.

BCA

Merit mark = Total marks obtained in Part III less handicap marks plus marks obtained for Mathematics / Computer Science (best of two) plus bonus mark if any

NOTE

Deduction of marks

5 Marks to be reduced for each additional appearance in the qualifying examination subject to a maximum of 20 marks.

Bonus marks

- 15 Marks for holders of NCC Weightage certificate issued by the NCC Directorate. (20 marks for holders of NCCB Certificate)
- 2. 15 marks for holders of NSS Volunteer certificate issued by the Govt. / University.
- 3. 15 marks for children of Jawans and Ex- servicemen.
